Below are just a few examples of organisations and projects in New Zealand making a difference in the community.

Ngāti Manuhiakai Hapū

Beach has provided and fitted AED defibrillators into Ngāruahine marae to provide medical support to whānau residing in rural communities, along with wrap around first aid training on how to effectively use the life-saving device.



Taranaki Chamber of Commerce

Beach sponsored the Taranaki Wellbeing Conference, attended by 104 local businesses and 350 people, highlighting workplace and community health and wellbeing.

Manaia Primary School / Cape Egmont Sea Rescue Trust

Beach supported Manaia Primary School students in a water safety session at Cape Egmont Sea Rescue Trust, focusing on vessel rescue capabilities and community support.



Outward Bound

A key initiative of the partnership with Ngāti Manuhiakai Hapū is the focus on succession planning and developing leadership skills in youth to prepare them as future guardian of the environment.
