Royal Flying Doctor Service

We worked together to support health education and community wellbeing. Joint activities highlighted rural access, preventative care, and emergency response. Collaboration improved referrals, outreach coordination, and shared messaging that connected families to services and learning opportunities.



Taranaki Chamber of Commerce

Beach continued as principal sponsor of the 2025 Taranaki Wellbeing Conference, supporting regional wellbeing through a popular event attended by 364 people. Five keynote speakers and 19 exhibitors explored mental, workplace, physical, nutritional and financial wellbeing across the Taranaki community.

Our partnership expanded hands-on learning through object loans, expert talks and co-designed workshops. Together we promoted local heritage, strengthened curriculum links, and increased youth engagement in science and culture through shared resources, promotion, and evaluation.
