



## Supplier curtailment methodology

This supplier curtailment methodology is published for the purposes of Rule 101B(2)(f) of the National Gas Rules.

### Circumstances in which the service provider may curtail the injection of covered gas at a receipt point

For the Bass Pakenham Pipeline, the service provider may curtail the injection of covered gas at a receipt point where that covered gas does not conform with the gas specification, due to emergency, to comply with applicable laws or regulations, as a result of Force Majeure or due to failure of, or repairs, testing, alteration or maintenance being undertaken in respect of the Pipeline or any Metering Equipment (whether as a result of human error or otherwise)<sup>1</sup>.

### Process for the curtailment of injections of covered gas at receipt points

The injection of any covered gas injected at a receipt point which does not conform with the gas specification, or due to an emergency or steps taken to protect the operational integrity and safe operation of the Pipeline or any Metering Equipment; or to comply with any applicable laws or regulations; or as a result of, Force Majeure; or due to failure of, or repairs, testing, alteration or maintenance being undertaken in respect of the Pipeline or any Metering Equipment (whether as a result of human error or otherwise) may be curtailed.
