A milestone 21st year of this partnership, the RFDS provides extensive primary health care and emergency aeromedical retrieval services across rural and remote Australia. Exceeding \$1.2 million helping to support Australians with accessible emergency healthcare.



Roderique Hope Trust

Beach helps support the Ready to Rent programme aiding tenants who are facing homeless, focussing on improving knowledge and skills, building confidence, empowering them to have a successful renting experience, ultimately maintaining a long-term rental property. Over 150 families registered with 90 of these having a place to call home.
